



## 1. What is SSAF?

In October 2011, the Government passed legislation (<u>Guidelines</u>) allowing universities to charge a student services and amenities fee from January 2012.

The Student Services and Amenities Fee legislation sets out the categories of services that the collected fees can be spent on, as follows:

- 1. providing food or drink to students on a campus of the higher education provider;
- 2. supporting a sporting or other recreational activity by students;
- 3. supporting the administration of a club most of whose members are students;
- 4. caring for children of students;
- 5. providing legal services to students;
- 6. promoting the health or welfare of students;
- 7. helping students secure accommodation;
- 8. helping students obtain employment or advice on careers;
- 9. helping students with their financial affairs;
- 10. helping students obtain insurance against personal accidents;
- 11. supporting debating by students;
- 12.
